Building Ramps, Changing Lives











As older adults age in place in their homes, some need assistance to ensure they maintain the quality of life everyone deserves.

This includes assistance with some light and, at times, heavy housework.

The North Central Alabama Regional Council of Governments (NARCOG) Area Agency on Aging (AAA) helps ensure these services are available for older adults in Cullman, Lawrence, and Morgan counties.

In recent years, NARCOG has increased the number of older adults throughout the region who have received chore services by utilizing federal funding through Title III-B of the Older Americans Act of 1965 (OAA) and the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA).

These Chore services include everything from minor home

modifications, such as constructing wheelchair ramps, to helping maintain a home's lawn.

In Fiscal Year 2023, NARCOG utilized \$18,000 of Title III-B funds for Chore services, building 15 wheelchair ramps for older adults within the Region, and installing a handicap-accessible shower.

During the current Fiscal Year, with the assistance of ARPA funds, NARCOG increased its Chore services to \$30,000, building 21 wheelchair ramps and helping six older adults with lawn care. NAR-COG also partnered with Fairview Church of God to help an older adult with a bathroom modifica-

With Fiscal Year 2025 quickly approaching, NARCOG plans to continue its dedication to Chore services, budgeting \$30,000 for this valuable program.



Hartselle Planning Commission

On August 6th, the Hartselle Planning Commission held the required public hearing to formally adopt the new Hartselle Comprehensive Plan 2045.

NARCOG Planning Director Joey Hester presented the new plan's vision and goals along

with maps depicting the future land use, zoning, annexation, and transportation plans to the planning commission and residents in attendance during the public hearing and answered questions afterward. The Planning Commission then voted to

adopt the plan as presented and recommend it to the City Council for their approval.

The City Council will hold a public hearing and consider adopting the plan on September 10th.

\$5,000 RC&D Grant To Improve Lawrence County Animal Shelter



The Lawrence County Commission has been awarded a \$5,000 RC&D Grant to construct four dog runs at the Lawrence County Animal Shelter, which will allow the dogs to exercise and socialize outside.

The total Project cost is \$9,800. Commission Chairman Kyle Pankey spearheaded this project with the assistance of NARCOG staff in preparing the grant application and the support of County Administrator Heather Dyar-Rose. The project will offer more opportunities for the dogs to exercise

and improve their health, quality of life, and behavior; and will assist them in qualifying for rescue transports. The more dogs transported out, the more space there will be for dogs to be rescued in Lawrence County.

There are 25 kennels in the shelter and around 20-30 dogs at the shelter at a time on average; however, during certain times of the year, the shelter will receive two to three times the intake rate. Rescue transports play a big role in rescuing dogs in Lawrence County. Additionally, the four dog runs



will be fenced, coming right out of the side of the building, allowing four dogs to run straight from their kennel into a fenced-in small area - at a time.

This opportunity will improve the behavior and quality of life of all dogs in the shelter by providing time away from their kennels so they can feel the warm sun and get much needed exercise. The Lawrence County Animal Shelter is unique in that it extends and opens the front wall to allow fresh air into the shelter.

Senior Nutrition Options



In Alabama, a growing number of seniors are facing hunger and malnutrition, and NARCOG is dedicated to reducing the number of individuals in the region who lack access to nutritious and sufficient food. Several avenues are available for seniors aged 60 and older to receive healthy meals and support.

At our Aging and Disability Resource Center, seniors can be screened for eligibility and receive assistance with applications for various programs.

Seniors can enjoy hot, nutritious meals at any of our 22

senior centers, where lunch is served Monday through Friday at no cost; for those who are homebound, home-delivered or frozen meals are available to qualifying individuals. The SNAP program helps seniors purchase healthy food at grocery stores based on income and expenses.

These initiatives are part of NARCOG's efforts to combat food insecurity and ensure that all seniors in the region have access to the nutrition they need.

Upcoming Meetings and Events

The Area Agency on Aging is part of a nationwide network of aging services under the direction of the U.S. Administration for Community Living and is funded through the Alabama Department of Senior Services (ADSS). This partnership with ADSS, working under the authority of the Older Americans Act, is to plan and carry out a comprehensive, coordinated service delivery system to address the needs of people over 60, or persons with disabilities of any age, and help them maintain their independence.
