## 22 Senior Centers Will Receive New Sign-In Kiosks



NARCOG is pleased to announce all senior centers across our Region will be receiving new kiosks from MySeniorCenter, equipped with an intuitive touchscreen sign-in system.

These kiosks are designed to be user-friendly, making it easy for seniors to check in with just a few simple taps. Once checked in, they can choose what activities they will be participating in and if they will be eating a meal. The streamlined process will not only enhance convenience for visitors but also ensure a smoother flow of operations at the center.

One of the key benefits of these kiosks is the reduction in paperwork. By digitizing the sign-in process, senior center managers will spend less time handling forms and more time focusing on interacting with the seniors they serve.

These kiosks are currently being shipped to NARCOG and tested before going live in the centers.

## **Medicare Open Enrollment**

Understanding insurance, especially Medicare, can be challenging, with numerous options and the need to select the best coverage. To support older adults in making informed decisions, the State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP) offers unbiased, one-on-one counseling to individuals aged 60 and older. SHIP counselors help Medicare beneficiaries review their coverage options and guide them in choosing the plan that best fits their needs.

At NARCOG, SHIP counselors can assist many Medicare beneficiaries each month. They offer information on Medicare, related health insurance, and low-income resources. This team can specifically assist with Medicare coverage, Medicare Supplements, Medicare Savings Programs, Medicaid, prescription drug plans, plan comparisons, billing and claims, rights and protections, and long-term care options.

With Medicare Open Enrollment running from October 15 to December 7, Medicare beneficiaries who want to review their plans, ask questions, or get help signing up can contact one of our SHIP counselors.

Appointments at the NARCOG office can be made by calling 256-355-4515. Walk-ins are welcome at facilities outside of the NARCOG office.

### **AGING SERVICES**

The Area Agency on Aging is part of a nationwide network of aging services under the direction of the U.S. Administration for Community Living and is funded through the Alabama Department of Senior Services (ADSS). This partnership with ADSS, working under the authority of the Older Americans Act, is to plan and carry out a comprehensive, coordinated service delivery system to address the needs of people over 60, or persons with disabilities of any age, and help them maintain their independence. Services include:

### **IMPACT GIVING**

The NARCOG Foundation is a 501(c)(3) non-profit that assists older adults or disabled clients to meet the unmet needs of other programs or services. 100% of the funds or items donated are used for client assistance. The Foundation can help retrofit homes, including wheelchair ramps, steps, handrails, grab bars, purchase AC and heat resources, and provide batteries for a power scooter with monetary donations. ## **PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION**

The NARCOG Transit Agency operates an urban public transportation system within the Decatur Urban Area. The purpose of this service is to provide mobility opportunities to individuals of all ages and abilities in collaboration with the City of Decatur and the Federal Transit Administration.

- Wheelchair-accessible vehicles are available
- Each one-way ride costs \$2
- Connect Cards (prepaid punch cards) can be purchased at the main office or on a transit vehicle for \$20
- Ride Operations are Monday through Friday from 7 AM to 5 PM
- Ride Scheduling is Monday through Friday from 7:30 AM to 4 PM

### **BUSINESS LOAN FINANCING**

The NARCOG Accelerate Business Growth Fund is a local lending resource to support business start-ups, or expansions that result in job creation, leverage private sector investment, and reduce unemployment in Cullman, Lawrence, or Morgan Counties.
